CUP has trained 14 Program Staff on IYCF and CMAM in July 2018, 23 in September, 11 in October, 32 LHS in November and 236 CHWs in September. Total in TOT 57 participants and Trickle Down 236 participants.
WEP Mirpurkhas has trained 17 Staff members and 42 LHS Master Trainers in TOTs in October and 316 CHWs in the trickle down training till January 2019. Trickle down training is still in the process.
